Title	How to Utilize Knowledge Sharing Program (KSP) of Korean Economic Development
Overview	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Dr. Hong, Song Chang, Director of Policy Consultation and Planning, Center for International Development, Korea Development Institute (KDI) was the speaker. Prof. Hyeon Park and Prof. Shin Lee hosted the event. A large number of students of IUDP (MURD, MUAP, MGLEP) and Global Construction as well as faculty members were present.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ The distinguished speaker introduced the contribution of KDI in Korean development history. KDI was established in 1971 and since then it has been acting as foremost think-tank for the assistance of the policy makers in Korean government.○ Dr. Hong explained the nature and purpose of the Knowledge Sharing Programme (KSP) of the KDI. Providing assistance to the developing countries has been one of the aims of the Korean government. However, KSP, unlike usual types of assistance programmes like financial support or soft loans, is a different type of assistance programme. It conducts knowledge sharing programmes for the assistance of the partner countries through which technical knowledge is provided for economic growth and capacity building.○ The KSP is structured on three pillars.<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Policy Consultation, through which consultation on policy making in specific areas is provided based on joint research of Korean consultants and local experts.● Modularization, for systematic documentation of Korea's development experience for effective knowledge sharing.● Joint Consulting, in which Korea's development experience is linked with the experience of the international organizations for conducting joint technical assistance projects.2. The speaker explained that the purpose of the present forum was to introduce the mechanism of the policy consultation programme to the foreign students of IUDP. The policy consultation is a bilateral program for which government agencies of the partner countries around the world having development and management

	<p>problems make a demand through the Korean embassy for policy consultation in selected areas. After a process of deliberation, the KSP selects the consultation projects that meet its criteria and then for each project, a policy consultation takes place with the partner country at the expense of the KSP in which studies are carried out and finally consultation report is provided to the partner country.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="320 479 1402 562">3. The speaker shared that since 2004, KSP has provided consultation to 55 countries for 861 projects.<li data-bbox="320 568 1402 651">4. The last part of the lecture consisted of a distribution of Project Proposal format to the students. The form was explained for the convenience of the students.
