# Foundation

ISUS has been founded with the aim to nurture urban and construction professionals, who can work both at home and abroad with the skills, knowledge and professionalism, which are called for in today's increasingly globalizing professional environment.

It offers postgraduate degree programs, Sustainable Urban Development (SUD) and Global Construction (GC), providing unique combinations of practice and theory in the relevant fields such as urban planning and management, urban and regional policies, project finance, construction operation and management. These primarily attract Korean mid-career professionals.

ISUS also runs the International Urban Development Program (IUDP) offering four differentiated degree programs, namely Master of Urban Administration and Planning (MUAP), Master of Urban Development (MUD), Master of Infrastructure Planning & Development (MIPD) and Master's Program for Future Global Leaders in Environmental Policy (MGLEP) which are largely subscribed by mid-career government officials from partner cities and countries. The IUDP also offers an intensive case study program for students from the West, currently from the USA and the UK. The school integrates a variety of perspectives and disciplines which are deemed necessary for passing on Korea's experience in urban development and management to partner countries who wish to draw lessons from it.

The academic programs offer abundant opportunities for domestic and overseas students to learn and interact across programs through lectures, seminars and special programs, that in turn contribute to building a network of people amongst able professionals who will be leading future urban development across the globe.

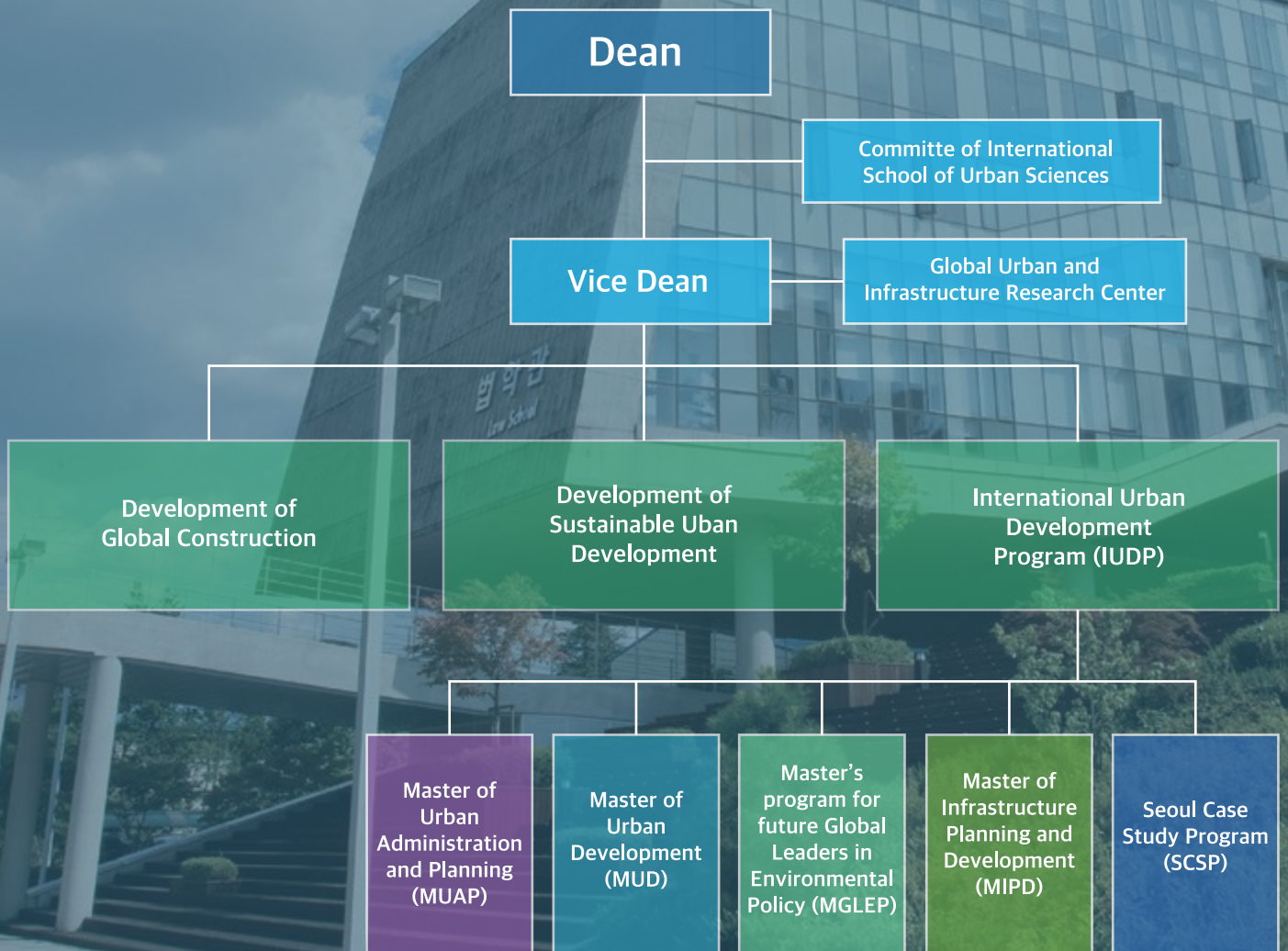

# Global Construction (GC)

Overseas expansion of the construction market is necessary for the domestic construction industry to move up to the next level. The Department of Global Construction aims to educate global construction experts with professional knowledge and network to take the lead in overseas projects.



## Goals of Education

---

Providing global construction professionals with systematic knowledge of construction management which will help them overcome complicated problems that normally arise along the construction processes and thereby attain their aims of being leaders in the global construction industry.-Educating professionals with both academic and field knowledge in the entire construction process including planning, financing, procuring, engineering, and managing for overseas construction businesses.

## Applicant Qualification

A Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university equivalent to a four-year Korean Bachelor's degree.

## Period of Education

---

2 Years (4 Semesters)

## Curriculum

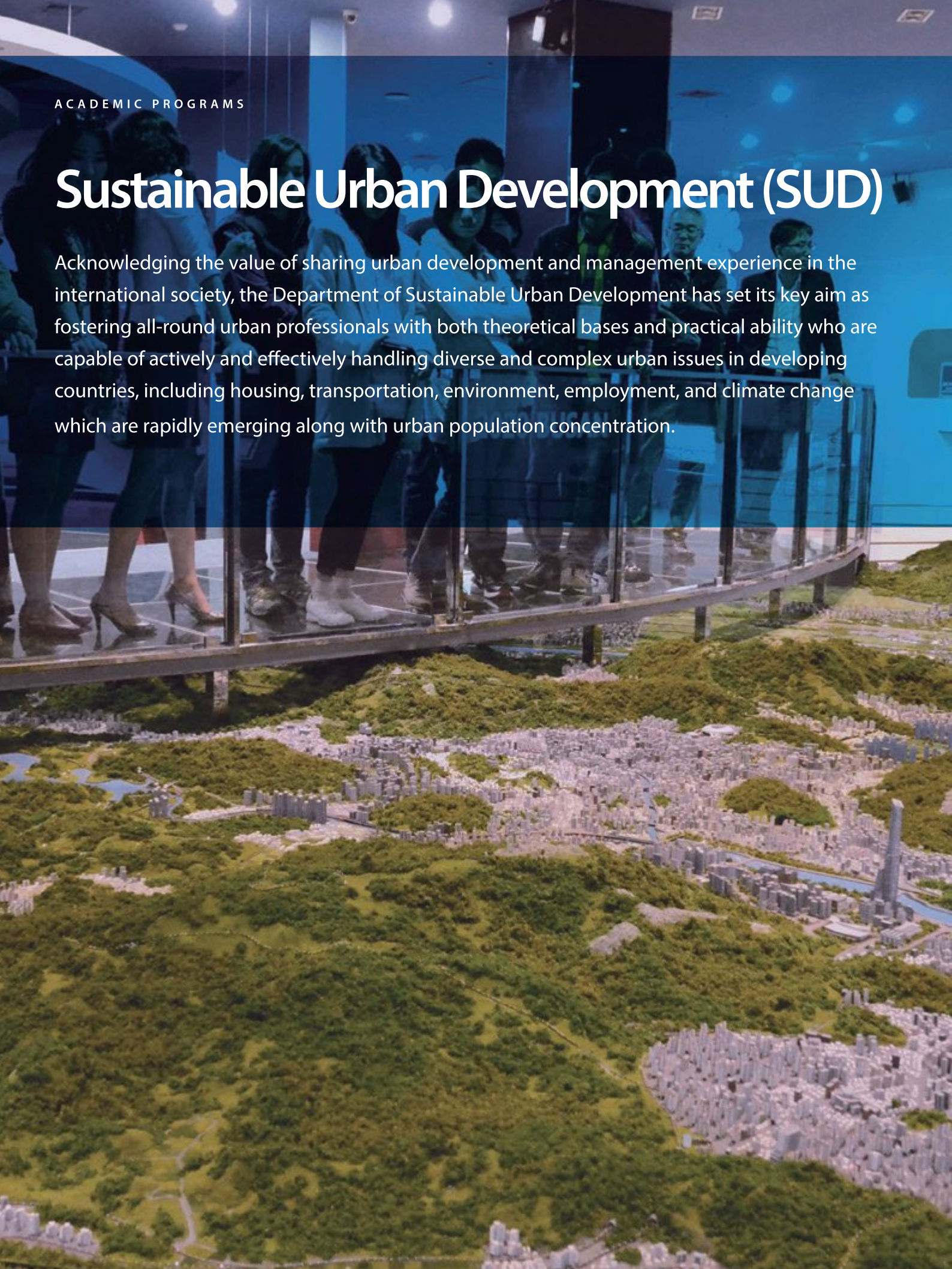
Courses in the Department of Global Construction cover various sets of theoretical and practical knowledge for the whole project life cycle. Specifically, the curriculum focuses on the planning or project development phases by offering courses such as Global Construction Market Analysis and Survey Techniques, Global Construction Feasibility Studies and Risk Analysis, Global Project Financing and Investment, and Global Construction Public-Private Partnerships. It also provides opportunities to develop communication skills and network with public sector project owners in developing countries by offering courses such as Global Network Seminar and Global Construction and Business Communication.

Cross-registration of classes among the departments(the Departments of Global Construction, Sustainable Urban Development, and MUAP(the Department of Urban Administration and Planning), MURD(Development of Urban and Regional), MGLEP(Development of Global Environmental Policy), MIPD(Development of Infrastructure Planning and Development) is allowed.



# Sustainable Urban Development (SUD)

Acknowledging the value of sharing urban development and management experience in the international society, the Department of Sustainable Urban Development has set its key aim as fostering all-round urban professionals with both theoretical bases and practical ability who are capable of actively and effectively handling diverse and complex urban issues in developing countries, including housing, transportation, environment, employment, and climate change which are rapidly emerging along with urban population concentration.



## Goals of Education

Educating all-around urban professionals with specialized theoretical knowledge and practical capability in addressing pressing urban issues. Educating international urban experts and global leaders who can share accumulated experiences and know-how of Korea in urban development and management. Educating competent leaders capable of promoting sustainable urban development and addressing global challenges such as climate change and increasing inequality.

## Applicant Qualification

A Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university equivalent to a four-year Korean Bachelor's degree

## Period of Education

2 Years (4 Semesters)

## Curriculum

The Master's program is comprised of four semesters, during which students take several core courses and elective courses to meet the credit requirements which differ depending on their choice of thesis writing. If a student chooses to submit a thesis, he/she will need to earn 24 credits in total (11 from core courses and 13 from elective courses). The students who choose to submit a non-thesis report will need to acquire 33 credits in total (9 additional credits instead of the Master's thesis).

During the second year, SUD students go on a field trip abroad with the support of the University. Short-term field visits to domestic destinations are also organized for the students, including the international students enrolled in the international Master's programs. Extra-curricular activities include the monthly seminar with renowned speakers, Urban Infra Forum. Cross-registration for classes amongst the domestic and international programs offered by the School is allowed.



# Master of Urban Administration and Planning (MUAP)

As part of the Seoul ODA business, public officials from the sister cities of Seoul are invited to join MUAP program consisting of theoretical and practical subjects.

The program aims to educate competent urban experts who can contribute to the development of their home countries and further international exchanges and cooperation.



## Goals of Education

Training mid-career public officials who specialize in city planning and urban administration by focusing on successful development cases and experiences in Seoul

Offering overseas students the opportunities to learn the Korean culture and language, that can enhance students' experiences and understanding of Korea

Developing a basis for collaborative relations between Seoul and its sister cities

## Applicant Qualification

20 public officials from sister cities of Seoul and partner countries designated by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs  
With a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university equivalent to the four-year Korean Bachelor's degree as required

## Period of Education

25 Months (4 Semesters)

## Curriculum

Preparatory courses include Basic Korean, Korean culture experience, English writing, Computer skills. The Master's degrees are awarded to those who complete the following courses.

- The 1st and 2nd semester: major courses (36 credits, 12 subjects), basic courses(8 credits, 4 subjects), and internship (1 credit)
- The 3rd and 4th semester: research for thesis, submission and final approval of thesis. Extracurricular courses include professional special lectures, on-the-spot studies, forum participation, and relation cultivation with domestic professionals.



# Master of Urban Development(MUD)

As part of the KOICA ODA business, MUD provides opportunities for government officials from developing countries to gain first-hand knowledge of Korea's development. The purpose of this program is to enable the trainees to apply what they have learned to the development of their home country or local community.



## Goals of Education

To provide theoretical and practical education that enable government officials from KOICA's partner countries to formulate a long-term national comprehensive plan for territory development

To enhance participants' knowledge and experiences in the field of urban and regional development including master planning, land use planning, real estate and housing development, urban redevelopment, and new town development.

To develop participants' capacity to manage infrastructure development projects for their own countries

To provide participants with opportunities to develop cooperative relationships and personal networks with scholars, professionals, and government officials from Korea and around the world

## Applicant Qualification

20 national government officials from KOICA's partner countries

With a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university equivalent to the four-year Korean Bachelor's degree as required

## Period of Education

17 Months (3 Semesters)

## Curriculum

Preliminary sessions include Basic Korean, Korean Cultural Experience, English Writing and field visits. The master's degree is awarded to those who complete the following courses. The first and second semester: major courses (44credits;12 credits hour for core courses, 24credits hour for elective courses, 8 credits hour for Language, and 1 credit for Internship.), the third semester: thesis semester during which students are required to write and submit a master thesis and gain the final approval of the thesis. Extracurricular courses include special lectures, site visits, field trips, participation in the seminars, forums and conferences.

# Master's Program for Global Leaders in Environmental Policy (MGLEP)

As a KEITI ODA business, MGLEP program provides opportunities to government officials from developing countries to improve their capacity for developing environmental policies and for leading sustainable development and environmental management in their home countries.



## Goals of Education

To provide future leaders of our partner countries with an opportunity to study environmental policy and related fields at a prestigious Korean university

To enhance program participants' knowledge and experiences in the field of environmental policy and sustainable development

To improve program participants' capacity to develop and manage public policies for sustainable development

To provide program participants with opportunities to develop cooperative relationships and personal networks with scholars, professionals, and government officials from Korea and other countries.

## Applicant Qualification

27 government officials from KEITI's partner countries Korea

\* KEITI : Korea Environmental Industry & Technology Institute

With a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university equivalent to the four-year Korean Bachelor's degree as required

## Period of Education

24 Months (4 Semesters)

## Curriculum

The coursework consists of 24-credit core coursework and 12-credit elective courses excluding thesis course and internship program. Students are required to take more than 51 credits for graduation.



# Master of Infrastructure Planning and Development (MIPD)

MIPD program aims to promote sustainable development of its own country and foster human resources in infrastructure development policies through research on Korean style infrastructure policies and excellent case studies.



## Goals of Education

To provide theoretical as well as practical education, field visits and internship opportunities that enable government officials from the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport (MOLIT)'s partner countries to formulate a long-term national comprehensive plan for territory development

To develop participants' faculty of embracing a wide range of urban and regional development plans as well as projects that encompass infrastructure planning, material procurement and construction

To enhance participants' breadth of knowledge and experiences in the field of urban and regional development including master planning, land use planning, real estate and housing development, urban redevelopment, new town development, etc.

## Applicant Qualification

20 national government officials from MOLIT's partner countries

With a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university equivalent to the four-year Korean Bachelor's degree as required

## Period of Education

17 Months (3 Semesters)

## Curriculum

A total of 51 credits including Major core/electives, Common core etc.(including global project, internship, and thesis research)

Preliminary sessions include Basic Korean, Korean Cultural Experience, English Writing and field visits. The master's degree is awarded to those who complete the following courses.

The first and second semester: Major courses(30 credits: 9 credits hour for Major core courses, 21 credits hour for Major elective courses) & Common core courses(6 credits hour).

The third semester: thesis semester during which students are required to write and submit a master thesis and gain the final approval of the thesis. Extracurricular courses include special lectures, site visits, field trips, participation in the seminars, forums and conferences.



# Seoul Case Study Program (SCSP)

Case Study on the Policy Management in Seoul: Seoul Case Study Program (SCSP) is a part of the effort of Seoul Metropolitan Government (SMG) to foster international cooperation. It was established by signing MOUs with eleven universities in the United States(U.S.) in 2010 for the purpose of promoting Seoul's successful city policies and establishing a global network to provide young scholars with a body of knowledge regarding policy issues in Seoul. The program is designed as a 7-day study abroad program for the U.S. and U.K. universities to visit Seoul, one of the world's most dynamic cities.

In partnership with the University of Seoul (UOS), SMG designed and launched the SCSP for graduate students in public administration and urban sciences to experience and understand Korea's politics, economy and culture during their stay in one of Asia's largest, most modern and progressive cities. The program provides a window of opportunity for academic cooperation, and exchange of ideas for the management of modern mega cities featuring the following topics: Urban Planning / E-government / Welfare / Public Transportation System / Housing Policy / Human Resource Management System and etc.

Since its establishment in 2010, eleven universities from the U.S. and three universities from U.K. have participated in the program. As of June 2023, 923 participants from fourteen universities have completed the program and the result has been evidently positive as participating universities have shown their keen interest in joining the program.

International School of Urban Sciences (ISUS) at UOS serves as a platform for implementing the SCSP. ISUS at UOS is responsible for managing the program and the staffs are dedicated to the management of the program. The program runs two times a year in May and October.



## Goals of Education

---

To support young scholars to gain a better understanding of Seoul's various policies

To provide opportunities to gain experience in the urban and traditional culture of Seoul through numerous field trips

To enable participants to engage in policy debates with Seoul's public officials who are in charge of the policy implementation

To assist participants to specialize in the field of comparative public administration

To establish a network of urban scholars and analysts interested in the City of Seoul

To share Seoul's experience with urban management and public administration with the international community

# Extra Curricular Activities

Joining an ISUS program will allow students to meet new people and learn that the UOS campus and a variety of programs can offer through campus life.

## Field Studies

### Site Visits

The program arranges four half-day site visits which can help students gain more practical knowledge of urban and regional development. The site visits also include cultural activities which can help students better understand the Korean culture and society.



### Field Trip

The program offers two field trips which can provide students the opportunities to learn exemplary development projects in different parts of Korea including southeastern and southwestern parts of the Korean peninsula.



## Internship/Job Shadow Opportunities

The program provides internship opportunities for the students to gain more practical knowledge of urban and regional development in Korea on sponsoring or cooperating agencies. The students will be able to do an internship/job shadow during the winter break session or thesis writing period.



## Urban Infra Forum

A discussion forum where domestic & overseas experts in urban development and infrastructure construction present, discuss and engage with each other. By bringing together public officials and practitioners from various countries, the forum acts as a platform for international networking and mutual learning.



## ISUS Field Trip

As Korean and foreigner participate in this program together, it forms a human network and strengthens bonds among all members of ISUS in Korea through visiting field trip twice a year and networking events in the metropolitan area and surrounding areas.



## Global Friends Night

It is a networking event held once a year to increase the sense of belonging of all current students, alumni, and new students of ISUS and to strengthen relationship.



## Global Project Development Fair

In order to commercialize the excellent presentation materials produced during the 'Global Project Development' class, which is a team project of Korean and foreign students, a workshop is conducted by inviting officials from relevant organizations.

# Campus Information



## On-Campus Accommodation

There are two types of on-campus housing, Student dormitory and International House. Student Dormitory has 309 rooms with double occupancy and accommodates 624 residents. International House has units with 2/3/4 rooms and accommodates 494 residents. All the rooms are fully equipped with central heating, individual A/C, and LAN. Each room has individual bed, closet, desk and chair. Shower room and toilet are shared. Coin Laundry is located in the basement and open 24 hour.



## University Gym and Wellness Center

Home to general physical education, the University Gym and wellness Center are used for instruction as well as for various sport and recreational activities. Various indoor and outdoor sport activities such as basketball, volleyball, table tennis, tennis, badminton, yoga and aerobics are provided for.





## Health Insurance and University Health Center

All foreign students are required to purchase health insurance either in their home country or in Korea. The insurance premium can be different according to age or gender in Korea. University Health Center is located on the second floor of the Student Center. Two certified nurses stay everyday and a doctor visits once a week there. The center assists emergency medical service, transfers to hospitals, health and nutrition consultation all free of charge. The University Health Center is open weekdays, 9:00-18:00 (Lunch break between 12:00 and 13:00) and Saturdays, 09:00-12:00.



## Cafeterias and Snack bars

There are five cafeterias on campus that serve affordable, healthy, and tasty meals. The largest cafeteria is on the first floor of the Student Center with 650 seats, serving breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Other cafeterias are on the second floor of the Student Center and on the first floor of the National Science Building with 177 and 210 seats respectively, both serving lunch and dinner. The newly opened cafeteria right next to student dormitory also affords 125 seats. Subway in Mirae Hall, first floor specializes in submarine sandwiches and wraps, salads and beverages.





# Campus Information

## Global Café S

Global Cafe S is a multi-functional space. UOS students and international students from various countries share this space. As a hub of cultural exchange, students are able to communicate in different languages. A foreign exchange student can work at the cafe as an instructor of his/her mother language. Global Cafe S is managed by the Institute of International Cooperation and Education.



## Banking, Postal, and Internet Services

There is a branch of Woori Bank on campus. It is on the first floor of the Main Building. There are also ATMs in several buildings. The bank opens 09:00–16:00 on weekdays. There are numerous banks within ten minutes' walking distance from the campus. Post Office is located on the first floor of the Natural Science Building. It is open on weekdays between 09:00–18:00. Free internet access is available at many spots on campus, but the most accessible place is the Central Library.





## Global Kitchen

The International House has a community kitchen for students to cook their own food occasionally. Many international students use this community kitchen to cook their own ethnic food and share it with other international or Korean students



## Computing Facilities & Student Chamber

Many computer labs are available in UOS. In Korea, IBM is more widely used than MAC. Internet access is generally available, but is particularly good in the Student Lounge in the 21st Century Building(first floor) and the Main Library. If you bring your laptop, you can access the Internet in your dorm room with the LAN cable which you need to prepare by yourself.

Student Chamber within the ISUS is a space for communication and socializing. English OS are installed on the computers in the room, where you can also print for free.
